### Day 1: MUNICH

- 🇩🇪 Arrival in Munich, check-in at the hotel
- 🇩🇪 In the morning, City tour of the Bavarian Capital.
- 🇩🇪 In the afternoon, enjoy a “**Beer and Brewery Tour**” i.e. history of beer, brewing traditions in Bavaria, other interesting facts on Beer as in the “purity” law of 1516, brewing process and The Typical Brewery.
- 🇩🇪 In the evening, Bavarian evening with music and dinner at the famous **Hofbräuhaus**.

### Day 2: MUNICH

- 🇩🇪 Breakfast then visit the impressive **BMW World** in Munich with audio guides. The BMW Factory and Museum convey the Brand's innovative power and trend-setting approach whilst exhibiting its dynamism and elegance in an unprecedented **Automobiles' Exhibition**.
- 🇩🇪 In the afternoon, experience a new level of shopping at the Munich's Fashion Shops in **Residenzstraße**, **Theatinerstraße**, the luxury mile **Maximilianhoefe**, the exclusive **Luitpoldblock** boulevard, **Schwabing Quarter**, and the pedestrian zone of **Kaufinger Strasse**, **Sendlinger Straße**, etc.
- 🇩🇪 In the evening, enjoy a meal in a traditional Bavarian restaurant.

### Day 3: STUTT GART

- 🇩🇪 Breakfast then head towards **Stuttgart**. Check-in at the hotel.
- 🇩🇪 In the morning, discover historical, architectural and scenic highlights of Stuttgart on a guided city tour.
- 🇩🇪 In the afternoon, visit the outstanding **Mercedes-Benz Museum** in Stuttgart, built in an astonishing architecture. Relish the 1,500 exhibits in 16,500 m<sup>2</sup>. This Automobile guided tour illustrates an overview of the History and Future of Mobility.

- Afterwards visit the **Porsche Museum** featuring around 80 vehicles and several small exhibits. Admire the world-famous iconic vehicles, such as the 356, 550, 911, and 917; exhibits include some of the outstanding technical achievements of **Professor Ferdinand Porsche** from the early 20<sup>th</sup> century.
- In the evening, savor Stuttgart's good food and wine. A "city between forest and vineyards". Try Swabian specialties in a typical restaurant.

#### Day 4: NURBURG - BADEN-BADEN

- Breakfast then check out.
- Journey to **Nürburgring**, the Motorsport Complex, located around the village of Nürburg. It features a modern *Grand Prix Race Track* built in 1984, and a longer *Old North Loop Track* built in the 1920's around the village and **Nürburg's medieval Castle** in the **Eifel Mountains**. Choose from a wide range of activities and drive around!
- Continue to **Baden-Baden** and check in at the hotel.

#### Day 5: BADEN-BADEN

- Breakfast then enjoy a guided tour in **Baden-Baden**. Take the funicular railway (Europe's steepest and most technically advanced) to admire the **Mercur Mountain** (670 m, highest point in Baden-Baden).
- In the afternoon, lose your senses at world famous thermal baths. Visit **Caracalla baths** and its 7 swimming pools, or the **Cara Vitalis World of Wellness** and its wellness facilities or **Friedrich baths** known for its Roman-Irish bath. Overnight at the hotel.

Day 6: Breakfast then transfer to airport, time to bid Farewell to Grand Germany!

### MUNICH



- **FRAUENKIRCHE Church of Our Lady** - with its distinctive “welsche” domes, twin spires, around the Gothic Cathedral of Our Lady (Zu unserer Lieben Frau) - is one of Munich’s best-known landmarks.
- **MARIENPLATZ**, Town Hall Glockenspiel. The Marienplatz (Virgin Mary Square) has been the centre of Munich ever since the city’s founding. It is dominated by the Neo-Gothic Town Hall with a glockenspiel in the tower, which still plays every day at 11, 12 and 17h (summer months).
- **PINAKOTHEK DER MODERNE** Munich’s newest museum and one of the world’s biggest art museums.
- **RESIDENZ PALACE**, the town palace of the Wittelsbachs is in the heart of Munich - Unforgettable, with magnificent Renaissance, Baroque and Rococo interiors.
- **NYPHENBURG PALACE**, is the summer residence of Bavarian kings and birthplace of King Ludwig II. The artistic interior décor, Ludwig II’s “Gallery of Beauty” and the spacious park with its miniature palaces make Schloss Nymphenburg - one of Munich’s top tourist attractions.

## STUTTGART

*Home to both Mercedes-Benz and Porsche, as well as the world-famous Stuttgart Ballet. Surrounded by the largest wine-growing region in Germany, it hosts Germany's finest wine festival every August.*



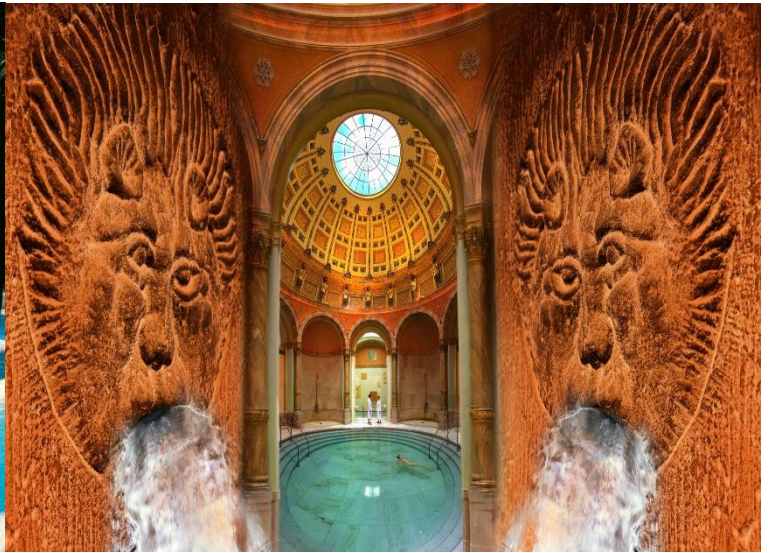
- Stuttgart arguably has one of the most beautiful settings in all Europe, surrounded by a wonderful panorama of rolling green hills, forests and vineyards. The many interesting sights in Stuttgart include **two city chateaux (Stadtschlösser)**, the Staatsgalerie art gallery and the unique Wilhelma zoo and botanical gardens. Baden-Württemberg’s state capital is also a top venue for hit musicals.
- The Solitude Palace in the forests to the west of Stuttgart also is the work of the constructional minded Duke Carl Eugen. He appreciated the location "At the Five Oaks" "far from the turmoil and disappointments of the world" when he wanted to rest while hunting. The Rococo Castle Solitude, which cannot hide its relationship with Sanssouci in Potsdam, was built in the years 1764 to 1775 by the building masters Friedrich Weyhing, Philippe de la Guêpière and Reinhold Ferdinand Heinrich Fischer.



## SIGHTS TO SEE

- Schlossplatz and Neues Schloss: Stuttgart's most beautiful square, in the city centre.
- Wilhelma: Europe's biggest combined zoo and botanical gardens set in a Moorish park.
- SI Erlebnis-Center with the Apollo Theatre, Musical Theatre, Casino, theme restaurants, shopping malls, cinemas, sauna and Vital baths.
- Mercedes-Benz and Porsche: Museums of the world's oldest car manufacturer and the famous sports car manufacturer.
- Fernsehturm: The world's first broadcasting tower made of steel-reinforced concrete.
- Bohnenviertel: Bohemian quarter in the Old Town with wine bars, popular pubs and antiques shops.
- Altes Schloss: Renaissance schloss, now home of the Württemberg State Museum.
- Neue Staatsgalerie: Masterpiece of post-modern architecture by James Stirling, outstanding collection of classic modern art.
- More than 40 theatres, 30 art galleries and numerous museums, including Car museums, the Wine-Growing Museum, the Hegel House, the Linden Ethnology Museum and the Carl Zeiss Planetarium.
- For a wonderful view of the city, take the over 100-year old rack railway (fondly known as "Zacke") up to the 217 m-high broadcasting tower on Degerloch Heights.
- 8-km long park known colloquially as the "Green U".
- Stuttgart has the most productive mineral springs in all western Europe; 3 refreshing thermal baths, and 19 public drinking fountains.
- Every year the city's great festivals and markets delight millions of visitors. Highlights include the Stuttgarter Weindorf wine festival, the Cannstatt Fair and the Stuttgart Christmas Market.
